Certified Pierce County Trails Community recognition program:

Overarching vision of this trail recognition program is to: Promote awareness and celebrate the benefits of community and regional trails, engage and educate elected officials, establish an ethic of and robust participation in public trail stewardship across the county, increase trail maintenance activities and local spending on trails, and ensure that local planning documents are aligned with region-wide priorities.

The program will achieve this vision through a 5-point criteria system. ForeverGreen Trails will review and certify local agencies as an official 'Certified Pierce County Trails Community', under the following criteria:

Celebrate and officially proclaim "Pierce County Trails Day"

 Engages local elected officials in local trails, allows for promotion of regional trail importance and the benefits of trails, establishes community commitment to trails

Hold a local "Trails Day" event

 A Trails Day event could consist of a trail walk, trail maintenance event, trail building project, adding amenities to an existing trail, etc. Also designed to be immediately after proclamation adoption – engages elected officials who attend a Trails Day event, allows local trail advocates to get elected officials on local trails to advocate for funding and maintenance

Establish an "Adopt a Trail" Stewardship Program

ForeverGreen Trails and local agencies would partner to administer a Trail
 Stewardship program. Allows for individual/community-based adoption of trail
 segments – promotes local monitoring of trail conditions, usage and needed,
 as well as establishes a local trail steward programs to improve maintenance
 activities and trail enhancement projects

Adopt and maintain a local Trails Master Plan

 ForeverGreen Trails establishes criteria that guide local trail planning master planning, with a specific focus on ensuring that local planning documents recognize regional trail connections and that funding for trail priorities are included in Parks CIP budgets

Allocate funding to trails annually

 Ensure that some agency Parks/Open Space funding is allocated to trail maintenance, enhancement or promotion on an annual basis



Under recognition of the program, communities will also benefit by receiving:

ForeverGreen assists in Trail Stewardship Program implementation

 ForeverGreen will assist the local agency by taking the lead in recruiting an assigning Trail Stewards to trail segments.

Planning assistance in developing, updating or amending local trails plans

 ForeverGreen will assist the planning process to ensure regional trail priorities and recognized in local plans

Financial and planning support to assist local Trails Day event

 Local agencies certified under the program also receive financial and planning support annually. ForeverGreen Trails will coordinate production of marketing materials, flyers and may assist at Trails Day event
