SSMCP HISTORY

2010 Growth Coordination Plan

The South Sound Military & Communities

Partnership was formed in response to the 2010 Joint Base Lewis McChord (JBLM) Growth Coordination Plan (GCP), funded by a grant from the Office of Economic Adjustment (OEA). The GCP process brought together military and community leaders to discuss how the rapid growth at the bases during the last decade was impacting the surrounding communities, and to develop a regional South Sound perspective.

New Direction Post-Growth

During 2014 and 2015, the SSMCP coordinated an update to the 1992 Fort Lewis Joint Land Use Study (JLUS) for JBLM. A JLUS is advisory in nature informing local and state governments with recommendations that protect the ability of the military to accomplish its vital training and operational missions while also promoting development compatible with military presence and protecting public health, safety, and welfare.

SSMCP TODAY

SSMCP is a regional partnership that focuses on the nexus between South Sound communities and Joint Base Lewis-McChord. The Partnership consists of over 50 member organizations spanning a broad range of interests from local government with the Nisqually Tribal community, Pierce and Thurston counties, 12 cities, various county and state agencies, several chambers of commerce and numerous non-profit organizations working in collaboration to resolve cross-jurisdictional regional concerns with compatible land use and growth management, transportation, education, health care, social services, and business and economic development.
