Welcomed Guests: Paige Hansen. Citizen of Lakewood since 2001 musician and works at radio station who was observing the meeting and thinking about becoming member.

Welcomed Bill Elder who is being voted on tonight at City Council as new member: has been involved with the arts east coast and west coast, started a theatre in Virginia, ran two night clubs, first CEO of Fremont Arts Council, print maker and life-long connection to art. Resident of Lakewood. Wood carving is his specialty.

# **Action Items**

### **Public Art:**

- Showed Power Point Presentation with example of what other cities are doing. Had a dialogue about what we can do in Lakewood.
- Taggers respect mural art and won't tag them. Could we have mural art on benches. Find a
  balance and work with the graffiti. Local murals that embrace that particular diversity of the
  community.
- Make a structure that is intended to be tagged. Designated graffiti. Tacoma did this.
- Goal: find space that showcases art that displays the art to be shown to its best advantage
- Perhaps in international area do a cultural mural.
- Idea of gateway to the arts
- Keep an open mind as to what the canvases are in nature and in the city there are unusually ways to incorporate public art (chain link fences, intersections). Locally oriented.
- Focus on areas that are eye sores, to beautify and/or areas around Town Center. Linda mentioned 4 areas in her power point.

Have a kids film workshop where they can learn. Taps into talent in our community. Adrianna can invite Kim who does the film workshops to our next meeting. Continue dialogue with AMC theater general manager.
