
Business Survey Results




SURVEY OVERVIEW

- Survey dates: 12/1/2019–1/31/2020
- 560 surveys completed
- Reported current/prior affiliation with JBLM/military: 51%
- Business leader/manager/owner: 56%
- Business leader & current/prior JBLM affiliation: 34%
- Business survey respondents by county:
 - Thurston **53**%
 - Pierce **47**%










The trend of sum of Number of Records for Recorded Date Day broken down by Recorded Date Year, Recorded Date Quarter and Recorded Date Mont







BUSINESS SURVEY RESPONDENTS' DEMOGRAPHICS




Years Operating in Pierce/Thurston County

Percentage of Employees Who are Veterans








INVESTMENT/ENGAGEMENT WITH JBLM-AFFILIATED COMMUNITY MEMBERS

PERCEIVED JBLM ECONOMIC IMPACT

- Business leaders tended to report lower perceived economic impact than nonbusiness leaders*
- Business leaders who did not report a current or prior military affiliation reported lower perceived impact than military affiliated business leaders*






FINDINGS FROM JBLM/MILITARY AFFILIATED SURVEY RESPONDENTS


- JBLM helps attract talent to the region—
 75% of respondents did not live in Pierce/Thurston county prior to their military affiliation
- When the come, they tend to stay 70% self-report as homeowners
- Generating local business:



BUSINESS & COMMUNITY SURVEY CONCLUSION

- The business leaders completing the survey tended to be independently owned/operated and part of the local community for greater than 10 years
- While most survey respondents indicated that veterans/military family members, comprise less than 25% of their workforce, 58% of business survey respondents do currently have some on payroll
- Educational/outreach could enhance understanding of JBLM regional impact and facilitate greater collaboration




CHANGES BETWEEN PREVIOUS AND CURRENT REI ANALYSIS

- 2020 Regional Economic Impact Analysis includes more data with greater granularity
 - Retiree pensions
 - GI Bill/Tuition Assistance
 - Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH)
 - IMPACT Aid
- Access to IMPLAN Simulations
 - More accurately estimate indirect and induced effects
 - Incorporates cross-region impacts
 - Assess spin-off jobs (indirect and induced) impact


Bottom line -- more resources, more data, more access and more time















State Impact ~92,128 FTEs

RESULTS-LABOR INCOME






State Impact \$13.9 Billion
