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### **CALL TO ORDER**

Mayor Anderson called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

### **ROLL CALL**

Councilmembers Present: 7 – Mayor Don Anderson; Deputy Mayor Jason Whalen; Councilmembers Mary Moss, John Simpson, Mike Brandstetter, Linda Farmer and Paul Bocchi.

Lodging Tax Advisory Committee Members Present: 1 – Chelene Potvin-Bird.

### **ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION:**

#### **Joint Lodging Tax Advisory Committee meeting.**

Assistant City Manager for Administrative Services reported that the 2021 Lodging Tax allocations are estimated at \$1,237,000. She shared that the committee currently has 3 vacancies to be filled by businesses authorized to collect the tax and 1 vacancy to be filled by a representative authorized to receive the tax.

She then shared that the 2021 grant process will begin with an open application period on August 3<sup>rd</sup> through August 24<sup>th</sup> and the committee will review and receive presentations at the annual meeting scheduled for September 18<sup>th</sup>. The funding recommendations will be presented to the City Council on November 9<sup>th</sup> with final approval on November 16<sup>th</sup>. Discussion ensued.

#### **Public Art Policy and Program Update.**

Recreation Coordinator Martinez highlighted the framework for a short and long term plan for adopting and implementing a Public Art Program. She noted that public art attracts tourism and shared the various public art located throughout Lakewood. She then presented options for future art which includes wraps for signal and utility boxes, murals, rotating and interactive art and iconic sculptures. Discussion ensued.

She then shared a design model for the Colonial Plaza public art project which is expected to be completed by December, 2020.

**Review of code amendments regarding Lake Management Districts.**

Engineering Services Manager Vigoren shared that in June, 2019 the American Lake - Lake Management District (LMD) was created to manage the aquatic plants in the lake. The LMD is scheduled to be in place for ten years. He shared that the proposed Ordinance will give the City the ability to charge penalties and interest for those who do not pay assessed fees. The Ordinance will come forward for City Council approval on July 20<sup>th</sup>.

Authorizing the acquisition of real property under threat of condemnation or by condemnation for roadway purposes; authorizing payment thereof from the City's General Fund or from such other monies that the City may have available or attain for the acquisition; providing for severability; and establishing an effective date. – (Ordinance– Regular Agenda)

## REPORTS BY THE CITY MANAGER

Acting City Manager Kraus reported that the Governor and State Legislature have extended the Open Public Meetings Act (OPMA) waiver through August 1<sup>st</sup>, the CARES Act Relief Fund grant application period opened on July 1<sup>st</sup> and to date 48 applications have been received and 62% of the City of Lakewood residents have responded to the 2020 Census.

She shared that last week City and Clover Park School District (CPSD) representatives met to explore ways to collaborate and share resources in the area of diversity, inclusion and community engagement and the City Manager participated in the Association of Washington Cities (AWC) Legislative Priorities Committee meeting where there was discussion regarding police reform.

She reported that it is estimated that the cost to implement body cameras for uniformed personnel is approximately \$153,000, which would provide 80 body cameras and a three year service agreement although additional funding will need to be allocated for video storage services and public records response.

She then reported that the City will receive a \$20,000 grant from the Washington State Department of Commerce to support energy and climate change to be implemented through updates to the Comprehensive Plan.

She shared that Police Chief Zaro is seeking volunteers to serve as a Non-Law Enforcement Community Representative to assist Lakewood Police Department in their role on the Pierce County Force Investigation Team (PCFIT) and information regarding the application process is available on the City's website. Discussion ensued related to the requirements of Initiative 940 and the interlocal agreement specific to directing the appointment process and the limitations of the legislative body.

She shared that updates are being made to the Federal, State and County Legislative agendas and it is anticipated that the City Council will review and discuss on September 19<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup> or 28<sup>th</sup>.

She then shared that City filed a Motion for Summary Judgement in the former QFC nuisance property abatement case which will be heard on August 7<sup>th</sup> in Pierce County Superior Court and Waughop Lake will be treated with the second round of alum this week.

## **CITY COUNCIL COMMENTS**

Deputy Mayor Whalen shared that he attended the Farmers Market last Friday.

Mayor Anderson commented on CARES Act funding that may be directed to the City through Washington State on a per capita basis for rental assistance and noted that this week he will participate in the Association of Defense Communities (ADC) Federal Outreach and Advocacy Committee meeting.

## **REPORTS BY THE CITY MANAGER**

City Manager Caulfield reported that this afternoon the Association of Washington Cities facilitated a conversation with Governor Inslee who provided an update on COVID-19 cases.

He shared that the city launched a CARES Act funding dashboard which provides an overview of funding allocations to date, it is anticipated that a recommendation will come forward requesting the City Council convert CDBG Cares Act deferred loan program to grants and Pierce County has awarded a \$7,000 grant to the Senior Center for COVID-19 response.

He then shared that the Comprehensive Plan amendment application and community outreach process will take place from August 1<sup>st</sup> through August 28<sup>th</sup> and 2021 Human Services grant applications are being accepted through August 22<sup>nd</sup>.

He shared that the Washington State Auditor's Office has scheduled an Entrance Conference for the 2019 audit for July 22<sup>nd</sup> at 11 a.m.

He shared that the second round of alum treatment was applied to Waughop Lake last week and it is anticipated that the toxic algae signs can be removed from the lake and a new invasive species, the curly leaf pond, has been found in American Lake which will be monitored.

He reported that the Parks and Recreation Department has updated the website to provide resources related to the cities two Community Gardens, to control costs the city has been limiting irrigation in various areas and last week the Parks and Recreation Director met with Nisqually Tribe representatives to continue prior

discussions related to options for native art in Fort Steilacoom Park and other partnership opportunities.

He shared that Pierce Transit Board of Commissioners will not move forward with a ballot initiative to expand services within the area.

He then shared that an updated financial report will come forward for review at the City Council study session of September 14<sup>th</sup> and the City is currently recruiting to fill the Municipal Court Judge position which will be open through July 24<sup>th</sup>.

### **CITY COUNCIL COMMENTS**

Councilmember Farmer commented on various road improvements taking place throughout the City. She shared that next week she will provide an update on the Sex Offender Policy Board meetings.

Councilmember Bocchi also commented on the progress of various road improvements.

Councilmember Moss shared that last week she attended the Farmers Market.

Deputy Mayor Whalen commented on the Waughop Lake alum treatment and shared that the Economic Development Board of Tacoma-Pierce County is updating their 2021-2025 work plan and is addressing community issues related to COVID-19 and focusing on eliminating barriers, promoting equity and inclusion of minority owned businesses.

Mayor Anderson commented on the Veterans Drive improvement project, Eric Heroes article highlighting Hamhock Jones food truck and he participated in the Association of Defense Communities Federal Outreach and Advocacy Committee meeting where there was discussion regarding CARES Act funding allocations.

### **ADJOURNMENT**

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 8:07 p.m.

**RECOMMENDATION:** By minute motion, amend a previous motion, Motion 20-28, related to the CDBG CARES Act Program, as follows: 1) Convert existing deferred loan applications into grants; and 2) Allow Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF) applicants (which is a separate funding source) who were not successful in the CRF lottery, to make application for a grant under the CDBG CARES Act Program, having an effective date of July 27, 2020.

**DISCUSSION:** A special allocation of Community Development Block Grant COVID-19 (CDBG-CV) funds was awarded to Lakewood totaling \$350,611. The funds were authorized by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), Public Law 116-136, which was signed on March 27, 2020 in response to the growing effects of this historic public health crisis. CDBG-CV funding is to be used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the social and economic impacts of the coronavirus outbreak.

On May 4, 2020, two proposals were presented to the City Council. The first was a proposal for a zero-interest, deferred (forgivable) loans up to \$10,000 to Lakewood businesses with 10 or fewer employees. The second proposal was a grant in the same amount, also with 10 or fewer employees. The City Council chose to move forward with a zero-interest deferred (forgivable) loan program through adoption of Motion 20-28 on May 18, 2020. The motion was written to require the program to return to the City Council later in the year, or early 2021. Upon return, the Council would review the program status, and if needs be, convert the zero interest, deferred (forgivable) loans into grants. *(Continued on next page.)*

**OPTION:** The Council could choose to make no changes to the current program. The Council could also not provide any special preference to unsuccessful CRF lottery applicants.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** No impact on the General Fund; minor impact (administrative costs) on CDBG Fund.

**DISCUSSION, CONTINUED:** The deferred loan program has been in operation since June. As of July 27, 2020, there are only 10 applications. Recent experience has shown that local businesses, if they were to choose between the deferred loan program and the CRF grant process, would prefer the latter since the application process is much simpler (no household income calculations) and assistance is in the form of a grant. Rather than wait till later in the year for the Council to reconsider the CDBG CARES Act loan versus grant, it would seem appropriate to do so at this time. A change to a grant program may accelerate awards, thereby assisting local businesses sooner rather than later.

The amended motion also allows CRF applicants, who were unsuccessful in the lottery, to receive preference for any remaining CDBG CARES Act funds. To do so, however, requires the establishment of a of an application conversion date. The date chosen was July 27, 2020. CRF applicants that did not receive funds would be moved from the CRF grant account to the CDBG CARES Act grant account. Here, these applicants would be given the opportunity to meet CDBG criteria and receive grant funding.

In the meantime, any new CDBG CARES Act applications received after 5:00 PM, July 27, 2020, if any, would be tolled. After the converted CRF applications to the CDBG CARES Act program had been processed, if there are any remaining funds, allow any remaining applications received after July 27, 2020, to proceed.

The terms of the grant are found in Attachment A. Attachment A was provided to the City Council on May 18. The terms are the same, except that HUD has recently updated program income limits.

## ATTACHMENT A

### PROPOSED CARES ACT ~~DEFERRED~~ GRANT PROGRAM

#### GRANT ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

This grant has specific eligibility requirements:

1. The business must be located in the City of Lakewood.
2. Only one grant per business or ownership group.
3. Business must have experienced a loss of income directly related to the effects of COVID-19.
4. The business must have been operating for at least one year, as of March 1, 2020.
5. Amount of assistance would be tied to the number of employees and provided in the amount of \$2,500 per employee, up to \$10,000 maximum per assisted business.
6. The business must employ 10 or fewer people including the owner, part-time and full-time employees on the business payroll at the time of the application.
7. The business must be a for-profit business operating within the City of Lakewood. Non-profit entities are not eligible.
8. Businesses must submit a Profit and Loss Statement for 2019 and for 2020 (through most recent quarter completed).
9. Business would have to submit payroll information documenting quarterly payroll and current employees.
10. Business must create or retain low/moderate income jobs for at least one-year.
11. There would be two ways to qualify for CDBG job creation or retention activity:
  - A) The business owner(s)'s household must be low/moderate income (if business has 5 or fewer employees,

#### HOUSEHOLD INCOME CALCULATION:

To be classified as Low Moderate Income (LMI), an individual or family's household income must be 80 percent of the median income for the county or area where they reside. These income levels can be further separated by low- or moderate-income. Moderate-income individuals have an annualized family income between 50% and 80% of the HUD area median income. Low-income individuals have an annualized family income of less than 50% of the HUD area median income.

Maximum household income levels by household size:

- 1 Person – \$48,450
- 2 Person – \$55,400
- 3 Person – \$62,300
- 4 Person – \$69,200
- 5 Person – \$74,750
- 6 Person – \$80,300
- 7 Person – \$85,850
- 8 Person – \$91,350

Additional CDBG qualifications for presumption of low income:

- A) An individual resides in a census tract that is 70% or more LMI; or
- B) The assisted business and job is located in a census tract that is 70% or more LMI; or in a federally designated Empowerment Zone or Enterprise Community with 20% or greater rate of poverty.



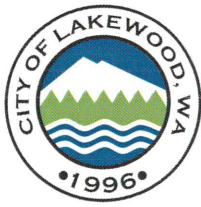

#### **FUNDING DETAILS:**

1. Applications to be accepted and reviewed on a first come, first eligible, first completed basis, subject to availability of funding.
2. Total amount the City of Lakewood is expected to release is approximately \$351,000 for this program.
3. Maximum grant amount, \$10,000.
4. City expects to distribute 30 to 35 grants.

#### **ALLOWABLE USES:**

Funds could be used as working capital for the business without any restriction other than they must be a documented business expense used for day-to-day operations. The expense could not be an expense that was also reimbursed as a part of any other federal, state or local assistance program, or for any expense that would be considered ineligible under CDBG program regulations.





# COMMUNITY VOLUNTEER POSITION ANNOUNCEMENT

## Independent Investigation Team (IIT) Non-Law Enforcement Community Representative

**Date Posted:** July 9<sup>th</sup>, 2020

This posting is for the position(s) of Non-Law Enforcement Community Representative to assist the Lakewood Police Department in their role on the Pierce County Force Investigation Team.

### **Position(s) Overview and Summary:**

With the passage of Washington State Initiative 940 in November 2018 and SHB 1064 in 2019, incidents where the use of deadly force by a peace officer results in death, substantial bodily harm, or great bodily harm require an independent investigation. The independent investigation is conducted in the same manner as a criminal investigation and state law now requires an "independent investigation" completely independent of the involved agency.

The goal of this requirement is to enhance accountability and increase trust between law enforcement and the community to improve the legitimacy of policing for an increase in safety for everyone.

Police agencies in Pierce County are meeting this requirement through creation of the Pierce County Force Investigation Team (PCFIT).

The PCFIT will consist of a team of qualified and certified peace officer investigators who operate completely independent of any involved agency to conduct investigations of police deadly force incidents. At least two Non-Law Enforcement Community Representatives will be drawn from a county-wide pool of representatives and assigned to each investigation.

The Non-Law Enforcement Community Representatives should have credibility with, and ties to, the communities impacted by the police use of deadly force. Representatives selected will participate directly in the vetting, interviewing, and/or selection of certified law enforcement investigators, media communications, and use of involved agency equipment requests.

This position will require the community representative to pass a department/agency background check and attend identified training that is relevant to officer involved deadly force incidents. The Non-Law Enforcement Community Representative must sign a binding confidentiality agreement at the beginning of each investigation.

This is a non-paid volunteer position.

**Responsibilities of the Position(s) Include:**

1. Participate in the selection of Lakewood PD's certified law enforcement investigators for the PCFIT.
2. Understand and be knowledgeable of statewide best practices involving the investigation of law enforcement use of lethal force investigations and applicable laws as they relate to the use of force and officer involved deadly force incidents.
3. Review and sign a Conflict of Interest Statement.
4. Review and sign a binding Confidentiality Agreement.
5. Attend officer-involved use of deadly force briefings with the involved agency chief executive(s).
6. Review or have access to the investigative file when completed.
7. Receive media communication(s) and press releases prior to their release.
8. Review use of involved agency equipment requests.

**Length of Commitment:**

Length of commitment to this position is two (2) years. This commitment may be adjusted based upon the needs of the agency and/or the willingness of the Non-Law Enforcement Community Representative to serve. The Police Chief will decide the final decision on the length of the commitment.

**Supervision Received and/or Exercised:**

The Non-Law Enforcement Community Representative will work with the assigned leadership team (Commander, Assistant Commander, and/or Lead Investigator) on each assigned use of deadly force incident.

**Hours of Commitment:**

The hours for this position will vary depending on the incident dynamics and the time and location of briefings, meetings, and needs of the investigation. Non-Law Enforcement Community Representatives may be called to participate at various and unpredictable hours to include weekends and holidays.

**Minimum Qualifications:**

The following are the minimum qualifications for the position of Non-Law Enforcement Community Representative. At the time of application, the applicant shall:

1. Be a resident of Lakewood, Washington and provide proof of residency.
2. Be able to maintain a strict confidentiality agreement with each deadly force investigation.
3. Be at least 21 years of age.



4. Have the knowledge, skills, and abilities to effectively perform the duties and responsibilities of the position of Non-Law Enforcement Community Representative.
5. Willing to meet the time and commitments required of a Non-Law Enforcement Community Representative position.

### **Essential Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities:**

The following knowledge, skills, and abilities are essential to be successful in the position of Non-Law Enforcement Community Representative:

1. Have the ability and willingness to learn and understand police use of force policy and laws.
2. Strong oral and written communication skills and the ability to interact effectively with members of police/sheriff agencies, and community.
3. Ability and willingness to maintain confidentiality.
4. Ability and willingness to make sound and well informed decisions.
5. Maintain high standards of ethics and integrity.
6. Ability and willingness to communicate effectively and resolve conflicts in a tactful and effective manner.

### **Training:**

The Non-Law Enforcement Community Representative selected for the position may be required to attend relevant training related to the position, which will be provided at no expense.

### **How to Apply:**

### Remember

#### If Stopped By Police:

- Remain calm
- Turn off your car and radio
- Turn on your inside lights if it's dark outside.
- Keep your hands in plain view.
- Communicate with the officer directly.
- Provide necessary information.
- Be respectable, and expect the same.

You will be asked for your signature if the officer gives you a citation. This is not an admission of guilt. It only means that you received the citation. Any refusal to sign the citation can result in an arrest or being taken to the station to post collateral and pay for the offense. If you feel that the officer acted irresponsibly, document the officers behavior in a written statement and submit it to the department. Then call the department and follow up on your grievance. As an entity that works to provide cohesion in the community, we'd like to know if you find success or not in your grievance process.

### Grievance

Every police department has a grievance policy. Lakewood Police Department is no different. If you feel as though you have been legitimately mistreated and that your rights have been violated, please make note of your encounter and take it to the Lakewood Police Department to file a complaint. ## What should I do if stopped by a Police Officer?

## Community Information Brochure

## Stopped While Driving A Car

If you are driving a car and a police vehicle pulls up behind you with it's lights on, immediately pull over to the right as safely as you can. Position your vehicle as far out of the lane of

traffic as possible. Turn off your engine, radio, CD player, and any other device that might hinder your communication with the officer. Turn on your flashers

and interior lights so that the officer can easily see that everything is in order when the stop occurs in darkness. Roll down your window so that you and the officer can communicate.

### Remain Calm:

Remain calm and ask any passengers in your vehicle to remain quiet and calm as well. Everyone in the vehicle should remain in their seat belts unless asked to step out of the vehicle. Stay in your seat and do not get out unless asked to do so. Don't be surprised if another patrol car appears on the scene. This is to assure the officer's safety.

Keep your hands in plain view, preferably on the steering wheel, and ask your passengers to keep their hands on their laps. Do not make any movement that might be interpreted by the officer that you are hiding or searching for something. The more cooperative you are, the less likely the chances are that the situation could go bad. Continue to provide information and communications with the officer and don't challenge the situation. At this moment, there is no need to argue with the officer. There are recourses that we discuss later in this brochure that you can take if you feel as if you are being handled unfairly.

### Identification:

Identification is crucial and must be carried in your vehicle at all times when operation is in affect. Having a drivers license is a privilege and not a right. Please, make sure that you obtain a license before you operate a vehicle. When the officer asks for your information, tell the officer where they are and then reach for them slowly. Answer the officers questions fully and clearly. .

### You can ask questions?



You have the right to question the officer. Make sure that the officer has finished his duties before you

**Know when to ask any questions you may have!**

ask him any questions. If the charge or citation is unclear to you, ask the officer for an explanation. Remember, be respectful when you do so. Also, ask the officer for his identification for your records. By law, they are obligated to provide that information but are sometimes offended when they are asked for their information. Try to maintain as much control over your own emotions to keep things from getting out of hand. If you answer the officers questions in a courteous manner, he should do the same for you. If you disagree with the citation or the officers actions, do not discuss your point of view at that time. Wait to have the chance to do it before a judge in court. The citation will show the date and location of your court date.

### Weapons:

If you have a legal permit to carry a weapon and you have the weapon with you, let the officer know about the weapon. Do not resist a pat down. This is done if the officer has suspicion that you may be carrying anything that would jeopardize the officers safety.

Use good common sense and be safe while dealing with a Police Officer. Know your rights and give and expect respect.

## Where is our representation?

I have been volunteering in this community since moving here some 5 years ago. To list a few, I've been a PTA President, a community football coach, and now the Chairman of the LAAPAC. I was raised in a family that believed in community based living. It seems more important now than ever, for African-American men and women to increase our visibility in the community. Our children are our future and they must see us participating in every aspect of community growth and prosperity. I ask each of you, if you can find one hour a week to volunteer, please do so. 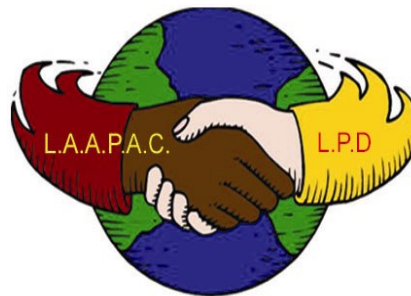

**Statement of Interest:**

When I saw the posting for this volunteer position, it interested me because it presented an opportunity to not only serve the community more, but also our local law enforcement. Both of which are near and dear to my heart. I immediately took the announcement to my church council president and elders to see if I had their approval and support to apply. Both of them gave me approval and support and agreed with my desire to apply thinking that I would be a good fit for the position.

As a pastor in the local community, I attend to our citizens from all walks of life. I attend to their spiritual, emotional, and physical needs. As a pastor I get down into the drudges and trenches of life. I am there during moments of both great joy and also great grief and sorrow and providing words of comfort and consolation as well as a listening ear. Many situations also lead to providing confidential counseling and support through difficult times and situations and refer to others with greater expertise as needed. It does not matter if I am serving the homeless, the lower and middle class, or those who are more successful in life. As a pastor I am called to serve and minister to the entire community.

This has led me to partner with various organizations. In my work with the church, we provide a food bank, partner with the clover park school district's family involvement coordinators which provides food, clothing, and other household items to needy families. I have worked to help those who are homeless and get them off the streets and into a home. This also means I do a lot of interviewing and vetting of many who come through my doors and have to make decisions on who to help and how with what resources I do have.

I have partnered personally with Harrison Preparatory School and Tyee Park Elementary specifically. I have served as a mentor to youth as an adult leader with the Boy Scouts of America, raised funds for Habitat for Humanity as well as participated on Habitat builds in our community, and partnered with World Vision to bring supplies to needy families throughout Lakewood and our surrounding region. These and various other programs to partner with the city and our community I believe puts me in a unique position to hear, understand, and begin to represent the community I have lived in these past 5 years here in Lakewood.

This community I serve also includes those who serve in the local law enforcement, the military, and other various positions of governance, public service, and emergency services. My church body believes in serving and supporting those in these various positions. We pray regularly for them, and seek to hold and support them in their various positions both ethically and morally. We pray for just decisions regularly and for wisdom and guidance in all that they do. Especially when their work is hard and difficult.

I also come from a family of law enforcement and military background. My father has worked as a Deputy Sheriff for DuPage County in Wheaton IL. He will be retiring this November. Both of my brothers have also served as Deputy Sheriffs for DuPage County in both corrections and on patrol. One now serves the State Department working in diplomatic security, and the other now works for I.C.E. in Panama City Beach Florida. Although I personally do not have law enforcement experience, I believe growing up in and around law enforcement allows me to see things from that perspective a little more than most who have not had that experience and can better empathize with the challenges that come to law enforcement families.

The biggest challenge I suspect to face is that beyond participating in a study with Washington State University's Spokane location as a test subject regarding police use of force in a shoot or don't shoot VR scenario, I do not have specific training in this area. What the program did reveal to me was the stress and anxiety that comes with those split-second decisions an officer has to make when a threat is perceived and later acted upon. In order to better serve, I would need additional training. However, I am willing to participate in any amount of training as needed to best serve in the position. Lastly, I have lived in WA state for about eight years between Spokane and the Tacoma area, five of which have been here in Pierce County. My concern is that five years in Pierce county and eight years in Washington total, although very active in the communities I have lived in, still puts me at a limited knowledge of the area and its people compared to someone who has lived here all their life or simply longer. However, raising my children here I believe has allowed me to assimilate faster. I look forward to being seen as someone who is more of a Washingtonian than a transplant as I become more involved with the community I live in and serve. With these experiences and qualifications, I hope you will give me consideration as a potential candidate in serving our community in the IIT position.

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The purpose of this memo is to provide Council an update on the status of the design of the JBLM-North Access Improvement project. In January 2020, the City executed an agreement with the Parametrix/BCRA team to advance design of the improvements along North Gate Road, Edgewood Avenue, Vernon Avenue, Washington Boulevard and Gravelly Lake Drive in preparation for the \$50M grant call for the Defense Community Infrastructure Program (DCIP). At that time PWE requested authorization to develop the project to a 90% level of design due to the number of uncertainties on design and grant funding. The consultant team was estimating \$240k to bring the design to 100% from 90%. PWE recommended only approving to 90% and revisiting the need at that time. Based on the remaining work to bring the plans and specifications to 100%, a supplement for \$65,000 will be needed.

The City submitted a proposal to the Office of Economic Adjustment (DCIP Program administrators) for this project on June 25, 2020 and anticipates notification of the projects to be funded by August 7<sup>th</sup>. Should the JBLM North Access Improvement project be selected, it is important the project be shovel ready by September 30<sup>th</sup> when the funding is obligated or shortly thereafter.

**Background:**

With this large project, the City will reconstruct the corridor of North Gate Road, Edgewood Avenue, and Washington Boulevard between the western City Limit and Gravelly Lake Drive. Gravelly Lake Drive between Nyanza Road and Washington Boulevard will be reconstructed per the CIP plan. Finally, curb, gutter, and sidewalk will be added to Vernon Avenue between Veterans Drive and Washington Boulevard. The use of roundabouts has been analyzed and will afford safer and better flow of traffic through each of the intersections. A total of 10 new roundabouts will be constructed and five existing signalized intersections replaced with roundabouts.

Design is at 90% complete and will be ready for advertisement in October 2020. The design team has completed the NEPA process and will be submitting the cultural resources report to the Army Corps of Engineers and Department of Archaeologic and Historic Preservation on August 28. Concurrence is anticipated prior to October 30. Right of Way is nearing completion. The project required corner acquisitions for seven

parcels. Four of the parcel acquisitions have been recorded, and the other three will be recorded the week of August 10.

**KEY DESIGN ELEMENTS WILL INCLUDE:**

- removal of existing pavement and complete roadway reconstruction on each road
- complete storm water conveyance and treatment system
- 12 foot lane in each direction
- 5 foot wide bicycle lane on both sides of Washington Blvd, Edgewood, and North Gate (Gravelly will have a 10 foot shared use path on the lake side as was completed on the previous phase)
- 6 foot wide sidewalk on both sides of the road
- LED street lighting throughout the corridor
- Planters and/or center planted medians per council concurrence on Washington Boulevard
- Roundabouts are the preferred treatment at each intersection
- Replacement of individual mail boxes to cluster type mailboxes where appropriate

**BUDGET**

Attached is the estimated costs and available budget for the project.

The costs shown are based on a preliminary level and therefor include a 3% construction contingency. This contingency is smaller than the traditional 10% contingency due to the size and scope of the project. The potential for significant cost overruns is limited provided no significant changes in the bidding climate.
