MEETING MINUTES

October 6th 2021 meeting minutes unanimously approved.

NEW BUSINESS

Members reviewed the 2022 Promise Work Plan

Brian Humphreys gave an update about the contract deliverables and 2022 work plans for the two Promise initiatives: Lakewood Thrives (Career Team) and Youth Mental Health Coordination (Clover Park School District)

Members reviewed the current plan for an in-person Youth Summit in Spring 2022. For the February meeting there will be more logistical planning after the Youth Council has had another couple meetings of planning.

BOARD MEMBER UPDATES

Elise shared the library is very busy. There is a new branch manager for the Lakewood library branch. The library will offer some social worker capacity to serve people having mental health issues who are coming to the library.

Kerri shared Communities in Schools is continuing to see and address the issues of youth mental health and transportation. CIS is looking forward to being able to bring their mentors and tutors

safely back into the schools soon. CIS continues to work with Warriors of Change alumni and look for opportunities to execute their strategic plans. CIS will present to the City Council about Warriors of Change on December 6th.

Ron shared the school district is hiring for jobs including substitute teachers, nurses, bus drivers, etc. The district was recently awarded a \$3 million by the department of defense to expand the existing language programming to lower grade levels. Three schools were noted as top 100 schools in the Puget Sound region. All students 18 and under continue to receive a free meal. Ron thanked the Promise Board for supporting the equity policy and shared the equity work that will keep going into 2022.

Mary Dodsworth shared Parks and Recreation will be doing a reverse parade just like last year. The reverse parade means the the displays are static and cars drive through. There will be a lot of events coming up, especially summer 2022, so there will need to be a lot of collaboration and internship opportunities to fill. The Community Collaboration could be leveraged to help coordinate figuring who is doing what this summer.

Mary Moss shared the public comment for transportation district ordinance is next week. The City Council is meeting with the policy contractors on December to discuss policy priorities for the next year. The City Council is excited about the Youth Summit in 2022 and looks forward to figuring out how to support it.

Megan shared the demand at the hospital has been decreasing. Patients were having to be kept in the hallway for a while but now the number of patients has decreased so that is not necessary. The hospital has had to decrease elective surgeries to have enough staff to cover needs since they have lost some staff. St. Claire had a higher number of COVID patients than others in the hospital system.
