UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Driving Tour Map Update

Ms. Courtney Brunell reviewed the recommended changes to the map of highlighting the historic streets program, updating the addresses for the Boatman-Ainsworth House & Lakewood History Museum and to add prominent City parks.

City of Lakewood

During the February 22nd Joint PRAB and LHAB meeting, an additional change was recommended to update the timeline to include additional Nisqually Tribe historic events and language to focus on Nisqually cultural heritage. Winsett Creative, the design team that created the map, has provided a cost estimate of \$500 for the scope of this work.

Next Steps: 1. Continue discussions with Nisqually Tribe. At this point, this does not have a definitive timeline. Staff will provide an update at each monthly meeting.

- 2. Once completed, bring suggested edits to the board for review and approval.
- 3. Staff will forward all approved edits to the graphic designer and receive a proof for final LHAB approval. 4. Once approved, the map will be updated and re-printed for future distribution.

NEW BUSINESS

Ms. Christina Manetti suggested Heritage Trees, such as Garry Oakes, in Lakewood should be protected as living monuments from early European settlers. Ms. Manetti inquired if this could be added to next year's work plan through Council.

Ms. Joan Cooley inquired about arranging joint meetings with other boards that have similar interests with LHAB, such as Planning Commission and the Lakewood Historical Society.

SUBJECT: Lakewood Touring Map

Background:


The City currently publishes a driving tour map for different residents and Clover Park School District. The map has not been comprehensively updated since 2015.

During the March 24th Landmarks and Heritage Advisory Board meeting the board requested that the map be amended to include significant parks in the City.

During the February 22, 2022 joint Parks and Rec Advisory Board and Landmarks and Heritage Advisory Board Meeting the additional change was recommended:

- 1. Update the timeline to include additional Nisqually Tribe historic events
- 2. Add language focused on Nisqually cultural heritage

On March 14, 2022 the City of Lakewood and Nisqually Tribe held a partnership charrette to discuss a variety of upcoming projects at City Parks. During the meeting, staff introduced the touring map to request their involvement. They have provided the City with a contact and are interested in updating the timeline and providing a brief narrative to include as part of the map update.

During the March 24, 2022 Landmarks and Heritage Advisory Board meeting the board voted to move forward with Hiring Jolie Winsett Creative to complete the map update. The board also requested that the map scale be amended in order to show more of the City including the Chambers Creek Trail & Woodbrook/Tillicum area.

Update:

The City has been in contact with Jolie Winsett Creative to discuss next steps. Ms. Winsett requested all map amendments be provided to her no later than June 15, 2022 to ensure she has adequate time to complete the artwork by August, 2022.

Ms. Winsett is also able to change the map scale to show a larger portion of the City including the Chambers Creek area & Woodbrook/Tillicum.

The City has reached out to Cynthia Iyall the Tribal Administrator for the Nisqually Indian Tribe to request a meeting and invite them to a future Landmarks and Heritage Advisory Board meeting to discuss other opportunities to partner.
