Arts Commission Sub Committee meeting July 17, 2023

Because this meeting was not posted publicly, there was a dialogue and consensus around the Mural Designs for the Fort Steilacoom Park bathroom wall.

Live presentation by Seattle muralist Angelina Villalobos

Angelina presented 3 concepts, going from most conservative (safe)& muted colors, to very colorful, to "your wildest dreams." The were called Discovery Trail, Stewards and Fortress.

Angelina discussed the importance in her work of education and stewardship and passing knowledge on to our children. She acknowledged the great job the City has done such a good job being a steward of the land, animals and birds in the park. She wanted her murals to have an educational component about wildflowers, birds, animals and the landscape. Animals now are confined to smaller places.

The Commission discussed what they like about each concept and how to move forward.

The most popular concepts were "Stewards" and "Fortress"

Some members suggested incorporated the bunny or deer from Discovery Trail into "Stewards" and making them more colorful.

Commission members also asked to incorporate the flowing background element from "Fortress" into "Stewards." Adrianna reminded us that there is a dragon design in the playground made of mosaics.

Council member Bell recommended including the Camas plant, native to the Nisqually tribe that grows at the park.



Angelina discussed the importance of not putting too many images in one mural, and that the wall is not a large wall.

She also proposed doing all of the walls of the bathroom, including the front so it can be seen from all sides and tell a story. It would cost an additional \$4,000 for a total of \$10,000.

Angelina offered, though it is extra work, to create a concept that includes all of the walls for our meeting on August 7th. It will be created such that if only one wall is chosen, there will be a complete concept for that wall.

Graffiti

Angelina uses spray paint and a graffiti coating. The coating has worked very well on her other murals. She has been able to clean off graffiti with just water.

Photo Ops:

Angelina said people organically find places to take photos in front of her art and they gravitate to colors that resonate with them.

She said some of her murals have a small gadget attached that has a 2 minute meditation. You scan it with your phone and it plays the meditation. The music is composed locally.

Coloring Sheets

Angelina also makes sketches of her mural that can be used for coloring sheets.
