Community Collaboration

Lakewood's Human Services department runs a monthly Community Collaboration meeting. The Community Collaboration meetings bring local organizations and community members together at Lakewood City Hall to discuss community issues with a concentration on issues affecting families and children. Community Collaboration meetings are normally held on the second Wednesday of the month from 9:00 a.m. - 10:30 a.m. Meetings are held at host locations by organizations throughout the city. Meetings may be attended in person or online.

First Responders

Lakewood Police Department

Originally formed in 2004, the Lakewood Police Department (LPD) has grown into one of the largest police departments in the state of Washington. Approximately 100 officers are currently employed by the LPD. In addition to general patrols, criminal investigations, and traffic enforcement, the department also provides a Community Safety Resource Team (CSRT).

The CSRT includes code enforcement and community service officers who work to address issues citywide. The CSRT focuses on criminal activity, nuisance properties, dangerous buildings, and illegal business practices.

West Pierce Fire & Rescue

On March 1st, 2011, the Lakewood and University Place Fire Departments merged to form West Pierce Fire & Rescue (WPFR). WPFR serves Lakewood, University Place, and Steilacoom with six stations operating around-the-clock.

WPFR provides numerous services to the community including fire response, Emergency Medical Services (EMS) and transport, technical rescue, hazardous materials response, special operations, fire prevention, inspections, code enforcement, and fire and life safety education.

South Sound Housing Affordability Partners (SSHA3P)

Established in 2021, SSHA3P is an intergovernmental collaboration between the Cities and Towns of Auburn, DuPont, Edgewood, Fife, Fircrest, Gig Harbor, Lakewood, Milton, Puyallup, Sumner, Steilacoom, Tacoma, and University Place, Pierce County and the Puyallup Tribe of Indians, working together to create and preserve affordable, attainable, and accessible housing throughout our communities.

The partner organizations of SSHA3P are keenly aware of the disparate impacts on the most vulnerable in our communities, including seniors, the unhoused, people of color, veterans, and working families. We are continuing to explore and work toward actions that can be taken at the local level to foster greater housing stability in Pierce County.

Military

Joint Base Lewis-McChord

The City of Lakewood is the host community for <u>Joint Base Lewis-McChord</u>, the only power projection platform on the west coast. JBLM was formed in 2010 by the merger of McChord Air Force Base and the Fort Lewis Army installation. Lakewood is home to many short-term and long-term service members.

The City of Lakewood also borders Camp Murray, the headquarters of the <u>Washington Military Department</u>, which includes the Washington Air National Guard and the Washington Army National Guard.

The <u>Veterans Administration (VA) Puget Sound Health Care System</u> has a large division located at American Lake, which shares boundaries with Lakewood, Camp Murray, and JBLM.

South Sound Military & Communities Partnership (SSMCP)

SSMPC is a cross-county partnership between Pierce & Thurston Counties, the cities within those counties, the Nisqually Tribe of Indians, and JBLM to collaborate on issues of common concern.

SSMCP projects advance infrastructure and regional improvements that support military readiness and the communities neighboring Joint Base Lewis-McChord. Projects encompass land use, infrastructure, traffic, community relations, child care, housing affordability, and economic development.

Regional & Local Planning

Growth Management Act (GMA)

The Washington State Growth Management Act requires cities and counties to develop comprehensive plans and development regulations for their communities. The GMA is administered through several layers of regional planning.

Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC)

PSRC develops policies and coordinates decisions about regional growth, transportation and economic development planning within King, Kitsap, Pierce and Snohomish counties. PSRC is composed of nearly 100 members, including the four counties, cities and towns, ports, state and local transportation agencies and Tribal governments within the region.

<u>Vision 2050</u> is PSRC's regional plan through 2050.

Pierce County Regional Council (PCRC)

The Pierce County Regional Council was created to ensure planning between Pierce County and its cities and towns was accomplished in a coordinated, consistent manner. The PCRC is composed of elected officials from Pierce County, each of its 23 cities and towns, and the Port of Tacoma. The primary responsibility of the PCRC is to ensure that the Growth Management Act requirements are coordinated within the County and the region.

PCRC administers the GMA through its Countywide Planning Policies

Transportation

Sound Transit

Sound Transit builds and operates regional transit service throughout the urban areas of Pierce, King and Snohomish Counties. Transit services include Link light rail; Sounder trains; ST Express Bus; Tacoma Link light rail; and soon, Bus Rapid Transit. With voter-approval, Sound Transit is in the process of <u>planning and building</u> the most ambitious transit expansion in the country.

Sound Transit is investing in better walking, bicycling, and bus facilities <u>in Lakewood</u>. Filling gaps such as missing sidewalks, ADA ramps or bike lanes, will make it easier to get to Lakewood Station and Sounder train service, as well as destinations around the neighborhood.

Pierce Transit

Pierce Transit provides transportation options <u>throughout Pierce County</u> and offers outside connections via regional transportation hubs. The Lakewood Transit Center, located in Lakewood's Towne Square provides regional connections in the heart of Lakewood. Pierce Transit also operates the SR512 Park & Ride.

Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT)

The Washington State Department of Transportation builds and maintains the transportation infrastructure of the State of Washington.

WSDOT recently updated the <u>I-5 Thorne Lane Overpass</u> that serves the Tillicum and Woodbrook neighborhoods. In addition to these updates, WSDOT will also add the <u>I-5 Gravelly-Thorne Connector</u> to give pedestrians and bicyclists access to central Lakewood from Tillicum and Woodbrook.

Utilities & Broadband


Lakewood does not own its utilities. The City works with several different utility providers to keep the city running.

Broadband

Broadband access in Lakewood is provided by privately owned utility companies. Broadband providers in Lakewood include Century Link, Xfinity, and Rainier Connect.

Electricity

Electricity in Lakewood is provided by three utilities: <u>Lakewood Light & Power</u>, <u>Puget Sound Energy</u>, and <u>Tacoma Power</u>.



Sewer

Sewer service in Lakewood is provided by Pierce County Sewer.

Refuse

Refuse service in Lakewood is provided by Lemay Pierce County Refuse.

Water

Water in Lakewood is provided by <u>Lakewood Water District</u>.

Workforce Development

Workforce Central

Workforce Central leads the workforce system structure in Pierce County, guided by the <u>Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act</u> (WIOA). WIOA requires states to strategically align their core workforce development programs to coordinate the needs of both job seekers and employers.

Workforce Central provides workforce data and information, performs community outreach, promotes job fairs, and generally supports the health and growth of the local workforce.
